The **ILC Project** initiative has 7 phases, including teaching youth to share their faith with their friends through life skill classes, worship nights, prayer, mentoring, evangelism outreach events, follow-up discipleship, and the opportunity for young people to put their new faith into an action by serving God through the ILC Project or on a missions trip with Fellowship Word of Life Church and New Hope for Orphans.

ILC Program Objectives:

- -To serve the community's orphans and poor students who would otherwise be unable to afford to study in private school.
- -To spread the Word of God and Jesus Christ to those who have not yet heard the good news.
- -To form an international community of education, engaging in the acquisition of truth and knowledge.
- -To give students the best opportunity to improve their abilities.

-To enable them to achieve their potential in knowledge and self-development.



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Nowadays, ILC has provided free education to poor communities with 24 volunteer teachers of 150 students. Through this program, many children and poor students can now read and write English. With the effort of volunteer teachers, the student's result of passing to the next level is increased. This really makes a difference in the life of the children, poor students and continually reaching the path of a brighter future and a great hope for them to have capable human resource to help and develop their own communities.

English, computer, and music classes are the most important things for ILC because Cambodians need a full scope of knowledge. We found that this is the key to bring the Good News to our students.

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Reaksmey's Testimony

I was born in a poor family far away from town. In 2000, I accepted Jesus Christ. In 1998, the village where I lived was in a remote area which was formed by clearing the huge forest. My family and I always attended the Sunday Services at church since my village has existed.

There was only one wooden school in the village. In the school, there weren't any tables or chairs for students. So, when the class started, I had to bring a mat to school to sit on instead of sitting at a table; others did too. When I finished primary school, I didn't know where I would go to continue my study

because the High school is in the town.

After finishing high school, it was the bad time for me again because I didn't know where to go, but I really thanked God for His grace in calling me to know Him more and being blessed by Him throughout previous four years. Moreover, I thanked God because I was the only one who graduated while the other students who were studying in my village could not.

After graduating from high school, I wanted to attend college but I had no sponsor. I wanted to work but didn't have any confidence. Nevertheless, God opened the first step for me to attend the Bible School called "**Rawling**" located in **Koh Kong** province. I had studied there for only three months when the school had some problems and closed. Then, I had nowhere to go. I didn't know at all about where to go, so I decided to contact Pastor **Phouek Sinai**, Director of the Orphanages, to try to continue my education in order to find a job. As a matter of fact, he allowed me to do volunteer work as a teacher of English at the orphanage in Pursat province. I taught English there for one month and Pastor Sinai brought me back to Phnom Penh to help with some work and he is trying to find a sponsor to support me for my education in college. Now, I am a volunteer staff, an administrator, involved in church planting. That is my desire, to serve God, from the beginning. I really thank to all workers for the ILC Project who have very great love for me.



Samnang's Testimony

Mr. Chorn Samnang was born in 1986. Before living in the orphanage, he lived with other people in the province of Prey Veng. Fortunately, God sent him to live at the children's home in the beginning of 2003.

Since he was very young, he wished to become a good surgeon. In 2009, after finishing high school, he applied at the University of Health Science and had to compete with thousands of candidates. God is good, and He made a way for him. Mr. Samnang was recruited along with few hundred other candidates to be a freshman.

Now, he is a fourth year student of the University of Health Science, specializing in anatomy, pathology, physiology and some other related documents.

In the evening, he interns at PreahKossamak and the Russian Hospital to earn more understanding besides hearing the theory at college. Since he has been interning in the hospitals, he has gained much more experience through practicing with real patients and especially by working closely with doctors who are willing to illustrate and teach him in the emergency and surgery rooms. Furthermore, he has gained understanding in urgent medical care. Lastly, his heart has more compassion to help patients, especially the poor. Nowadays, he is very involving with ILC as a volunteer teacher and he's the one who helps to organize our program.

So far, the ILC Program is moving step by step in this process. We have a lot of participants, who cooperate with each other very well, wanting to see it taking place in Cambodia. They really take their time to volunteer as teachers in this project although they don't have money. They want to share what they have, although it is like a mustard seed, to produce good things for their own people in Cambodia, especially the underprivileged. They want to see the people have opportunity to study and catch this vocational training from ILC which improves their chance of finding a job in the outside world. We believe that through this program there will be a lot of advantages for their future.

Five Classrooms were set up and equipped with tables, one whiteboard, and chairs, but we don't have enough for students who have registered for ILC.

One classroom can hold at least 25 students for each session. Right now, there are about one hundred students enrolled to study at the ILC. Teachings within the ILC program are classified into different subjects such as English, computer, and music.
